Sexual Assault Forensic Examination (SAFE) Commission Marshall County Service Plan

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Local Board/SART Overview

To meet SAFE Commission standards, Marshall County has formalized a coordinated response through the creation of a SAFE Commission Team convened specifically to meet the SAFE Commission's guidelines. Members of this local coordinated response collaboration include:

- o Marshall County Sheriff's Department
- o Moundsville Police Department
- o Sexual Assault Help Center
- o Ohio Valley Medical Center
- Wheeling Hospital
- Harmony House
- o DHS Child Protective Services

The local SART meets bi-monthly with the intent to:

- Share information and resources
- ☑ Identify gaps in the service delivery system
- ☑ Increase awareness on issues of sexual assault and stalking in the community
- ☑ Increase victim and community safety
- □ Develop professional relationships and an understanding of varying roles and responsibilities of First Responders
- ☑ Develop, implement, and review county protocol to meet legislative requirements of the SAFE Commission

ADVOCACY PROTOCOL

The following seven advocacy services meet core service standards in our county are:

- ≥ 24/7 advocacy, support, and accompaniment during the medical forensic exam, law enforcement investigations, and court proceedings
- ☑ Information for victims about reporting/not reporting to law enforcement
- ☐ Crisis intervention and/or emotional support to victims and their families
- Referrals and coordinated services with other agencies
- Support for victims through the criminal justice system
- Replacement clothing for victims after medical forensic exams, if needed
- Protection of victim privacy and confidentiality

Advocacy services in our county are provided by the Sexual Assault Help Center, Inc.

- The Sexual Assault Help Center will be contacted by the intake staff at the hospital through the 24/7 Hotline.
- The Sexual Assault Help Center will be present for the victim within 1 hour of the time the hospital contacts the Hotline.
- Once the victim presents as a victim of sexual assault or sexual abuse, the hospital will initiate the Sexual Assault Advocacy Protocols and contact the Sexual Assault Hotline at (1-800) 884-7242. An advocate will arrive within 1 hour and provide support and information to the victim if desired. The advocate will be present and available to the victim during the duration of the forensic examination.

First Responders will be informed of this Advocacy Protocol by:

Members of the team and identified first responding agencies will receive copies (print and electronic) and will incorporate the protocol into their new staff/officer orientation practices. Our County facilitates bi-monthly Sexual Assault Response Team meetings that include the Prosecuting Attorney's Office, representatives from all county law enforcement agencies, and EMS. The team will annually review the protocol at the first meeting of each calendar year. Their liaisons will be briefed on the Protocol and copies of the Protocol will be provided to their respective employees.

MEDICAL FORENSIC PROTOCOL

Medical forensic services for adolescent/adult victims are provided by SANEs which are available on-call 24/7.

Law enforcement or other first responders should contact the closest area hospital (Reynolds Memorial or Wheeling Hospital) to determine if a SANE is available/on call. Victims are then transported to the closest hospital that has a SANE available.

TRANSPORTATION PROTOCOL

The SAFE Commission requires that this transportation protocol must include the following four core components:

- 1. Accessible transportation, including the ability to transport victims with disabilities
- 2. Transportation to and from the medical forensic exam regardless of the victim's ability to pay
- 3. Plan for victim confidentiality
- 4. Plan to return the victim to their point of origin (or an agreed upon safe place) after the medical forensic examination

Protocol. When a sexual assault victim in Marshall County requires a medical forensic examination, and has no transportation to a facility providing such services, the following procedures will be activated when a sexual assault is reported:

Transportation protocol when no emergent medical needs are reported:

- Marshall County Sheriff's Department and Moundsville Police Department provide victim transportation to and from Wheeling Hospital or Reynolds Hospital.
- In the event of a non-reporting victim, the Sexual Assault Help Center, Wheeling Hospital and Reynolds Hospital have access to vouchers to organize a cab fare. To ensure confidentiality, the above entities will contact the cab company, provide the voucher or payment, and be present with the victim while entering into the cab. No identifying information will be written on any documentation other than the address to destination.

1. 911 Call With Injuries.

- If a sexual assault victim calls 911 needing emergent medical care, EMS and the appropriate law enforcement agency will both respond. EMS will transport the victim to the appropriate medical facility.
- If the victim chooses to initiate a police investigation, the responding law enforcement officer will document and report the incident. Law enforcement (LE) will stay at the medical facility, if necessary, for the safety of the victim or return when the medical forensic exam is completed to transport the victim to a safe location if needed.
- If the victim chooses NOT to initiate a police investigation, LE will determine the immediate safety and security of the victim and provide contact information should the victim decide to make a report at a later date. If LE is unable to provide transportation, LE can contact the Sexual Assault Help Center at 1(800) 884-7242 for assistance. SAHC and the hospital will provide confidential transportation options.

2. 911 Call With No Injuries.

• If a sexual assault victim calls to report a sexual assault, is safe and does NOT

need emergent medical care, the appropriate law enforcement agency will be contacted and will proceed to the identified location. EMS will also be dispatched at that time and proceed to the location. The victim will be informed by the law enforcement officer of the medical forensic exam and law enforcement report/non-report options.

- If the victim chooses to have a medical forensic exam and initiate a police investigation and does not have transportation, law enforcement will provide transportation to the appropriate local medical facility. SAHC and the hospital will arrange for confidential return transportation.
- If the victim chooses NOT to initiate a police investigation, LE will determine the immediate safety and security of the victim, and provide contact information should the victim decide to make a report at a later date. If LE is unable to provide transportation, LE can contact the Sexual Assault Help Center at 1(800) 884-7242 for assistance. SAHC will provide confidential transportation to/from the hospital. The hospital can provide transportation to a safe location following the exam.
- If a victim has a disability and needs a different form of transportation, and EMS is already onsite, EMS can provide transportation to the hospital. LE can contact the Sexual Assault Help Center at 1(800) 884-7242 for assistance. SAHC will provide confidential transportation options with no cost to the victim.

3. Call to Rape Crisis Center. 1(800) 884-7242.

If the victim has emergent medical needs, the advocate will ensure 911 is called. The advocate will inform victims of the medical forensic exam and law enforcement report/non-report options, and arrange for confidential transportation to/from the hospital.
